What about Riverbend's geese? What kind are they? Where are they from?

There are two main types of geese at our course. The Canada goose (not Canadian goose) is the bigger of the two, average length is 45 inches from tip of bill to bottom of tail. They are not usually migratory and stay here year around. During much of the year Canada geese associate in large flocks, and many of these birds may be related to one another. Most mate for life with very low "divorce rates," and pairs remain together throughout the year. The Canada goose honks.

The cackling goose makes a cackling sound. They are half the size of the Canada goose, 25 inches from bill to tail. They are migratory. They spring and summer in northern Alaska and the Aleutian Islands and winter here. For a goose to migrate, it must be taught the flight path by its parents. Therefore, all following generations of nonmigratory Canada geese will also be nonmigratory, or resident geese, which will stay year-round in the vicinity where they were born.

Geese are often seen in a V-shaped formation when flying. Such a formation allows each trailing bird to receive lift from the wingtip vortex of the bird in front of it, saving energy and greatly extending the range of a flock of birds over that of a bird flying alone. Scientists have suggested that flying in V-formation may also be a way of maintaining visual contact and avoiding collisions.

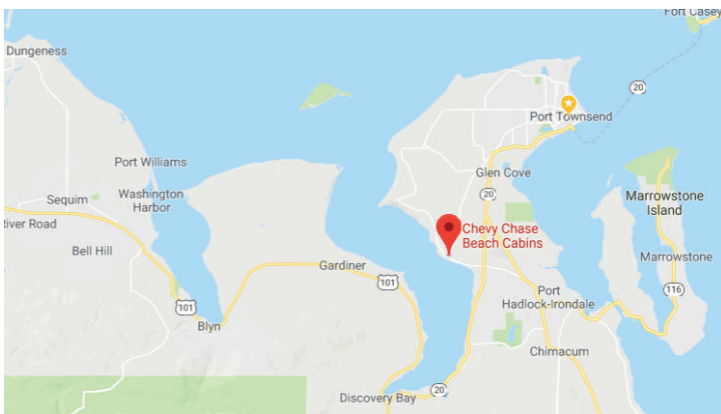
