

RLGA PLAYER RECOGNITION

Our 2015 competition in the Player Recognition program has come to an end. It has been a very successful season. It is time to honor the winners and encourage all our members to play during our reserved tee times on Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays.

2015 SEASON FINALE

Fifty-one members participated in the various competitions. Recognition pins were distributed to those who requested them. Payouts were added to each winner's Riverbend account. The winners for the races of Most Birdies, Most Chip-Ins, Most Rounds Played, and the Lowest Net Average received payouts.

Birdie Race: There were 33 ladies who recorded a total of 146 birdies. Every hole had at least 1 birdie. Hole #5 was the clear favorite once again, with 23 birdies, followed by 16 on Hole#13, and 15 on hole #3. Linda Selegue was the winner in this race with 15 birdies, followed by Cathy Coleman with 13 and Linda Pearson with 12.

Chip-Ins: Thirty –one members recorded a total of 59 chip-ins this year. Every hole had at least 1 chip-in with the exception of #7. Both holes #5 and #10 had 7 chip-ins. Several others had 3. Vicki Hutsko is the winner with 5 chip-ins, and Peggy Haugan had 4. Many players had 1 or 2.

Most Rounds Played: Fifty-one ladies submitted pink cards for this category. The clear winner was Laura Risher with 39 rounds!!! Cathy Coleman had 33 and Vicki Hutsko had 31 -- all pretty high numbers.

Low Net Average: First place in this category goes to Linda Selegue with a low net average of 71.4. Ok Lim came in second with 71.8.

Eagles: There were 4 Eagles recorded this year which is really an amazing feat. Cathy Coleman had an eagle on hole #6 on 5/23/15, Sheila Locke had an eagle on hole #3, 4/25/15, Mary Ryan's eagle was on hole #11, 6/7/15, and Marge Rider had an eagle, which was also a hole-in-one on #5, 6/3/15.

Personal Best: Congratulations to Vicki Hutsko who shot an 85 on 7/29/15 and Cathy Coleman had an 80 on 8/5/15.

Congratulations to all the winners. Thanks to every member for participating in this program. I also appreciate the effective use of the pink cards – I think you are all trained now!! Let's go back to the drawing board and prepare for next year.
